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
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About the COVER



holds the distinction of heading the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) sole procurement institution responsible to implement the programs of AFP units and the procurement process of the Bids and Awards Committees in order to sustain the logistical requirements of the AFP. As the 8th Commander of the Armed Forces of the Philippines Procurement Service (AFPPS), COL GUIANG has the most important role of organizing, training, equipping, maintaining, and sustaining four (4) Procurement Centers, Thirty-One (31) Contracting Offices across the Philippine archipelago, Seven (7) Bids and Awards Committee Secretariats (BAC), Reimbursable Fund Unit (RFU) and Headquarters Support Unit (HSU). Prior to assuming his current position, COL GUIANG was the Acting Wing Commander of the Tactical Operations Wing Southern Luzon (TOWSOL).

COL GUIANG has held several significant staff and command positions in the Philippine Air Force (PAF) and at GHQ which demonstrated his outstanding military leadership and management acumen. Among these includes as the Assistant Chief of Air Staff (AC of AS) for Education and Training, A-8; Deputy A-8 and A-3 all at Headquarters Philippine Air Force; Likewise, he was also designated as the ACES for Operations at Headquarters Air Education Training and Doctrines Command (HAETDC); Group Commander, 550th ABG, AETDC; UN Military Observer PKOC, GHQ & HSC; Chief Welfare and Benefits Branch, OJ1; Assistant Commandant, Basic Military Training School, AETDC; Chief Command Operations Center, HAETDC; Instructor Pilot, PAF Flying School, AETDC; Chief Wing Special Services Officer, 15th Strike Wing (SW); Assistant Chief Squadron Maintenance Officer, 18th Attack Squadron (AS); Operations Officer, 15th SW; Standard and Evaluation Officer, 15th SW and 18th AS; Element Lead MD 520MG 15th SW; CMO Officer, 18th AS; Historical Officer, 18th AS; Supply Officer, 18th AS; Combat Ready Pilot MG-520 18th AS; and Assistant Finance Officer 18th AS.



He also holds numerous Letters of Commendation (LOC) and Plaques of Recognition.

He completed the Command General Staff Course in 2011 and he holds a Master's Degree in Public Administration, Organization and Management from the Philippine Christian University in Manila.

Implementation of Early Procurement Activities (EPA)

The Implementing Guidelines of the Circular direct all Heads of Departments, Bureaus, Offices and Agencies of the National Government, including State Universities and Colleges, Government-Owned or Controlled Corporations, Government Financial Institutions, and Local Government Units for the conduct of procurement activities, from posting of the procurement opportunity, if required, until recommendation of the Bids and Awards Committee (BAC) to the HoPE as to the award of the contract, for goods to be delivered, infrastructure projects to be implemented and consulting services to be rendered in the following fiscal year, pending approval of their respective funding sources.

In compliance with the Circular, the Philippine Army Bids and Awards Committee (PABAC) through the Assistant Chief of Staff for Logistics, G4, PA has conducted the advance bidding of the following projects for Calendar Year 2020:

To insure that compliance with EPA will be achieved, the BAC Secretariat as the main support unit of the PABAC, will insure the timely submission of the Post-Qualification (PQ) Reports of the various Technical Working Groups on the aforementioned items bid out. With this, the award of contract for procurement projects undertaken through EPA will be undertaken the following year upon approval and effectiveness of their respective funding sources.


The 15th Strike Wing of the Philippine Air Force is scheduled to be relocated at Lumbia Airport in Barangay Lumbia, Cagayan De Oro City. The Department of National Defense (DND) delegated the project Design and Build of the Site Development, Operational,

and Operational Support Facilities of the 15th Strike Wing in Lumbia Airport, Cagayan de Oro City with an Approved Budget for the Contract of PhP974,569,400.00 to the Philippine Air Force through its PAF Bids and Awards Committee.

The said project was finally successfully bid out last 08 November 2019 after two (2) failure of bidding. Out of the eleven (11) companies that joined the project, only three (3) passed the Eligibility and Technical Component. The Opening and Evaluation of Bids lasted for seventeen (17) hours which is the first longest evaluation in the record of PAFBAC. During the financial evaluation, AV Pamatong Trading & Construction, Inc. emerged as the company with the Lowest Calculated Bid Price of PhP877,069,376.82. The Philippine Air Force Bids and Awards Committee realized a residual/savings of PhP97,500,023.18 in the said project which can be utilized for future procurement projects of the Armed Forces of the Philippines.

The Armed Forces of The Philippines Procurement Service (AFPPS) with its mandate to support and promote the implementation of the AFP Transformation Roadmap (AFPTR) had established, implemented, and synchronized its existing and future programs, projects and activities aligned to it. In line with this, Team GSMO has presented the update and was commended amongst the presenters by no other than the Vice Chief of Staff, AFP (VCSAFP) during the presentation and updating at Silid Lapu-Lapu on 04 December 2019. Since the TEAM proposed a new AFPPS Mission Statement (which was approved on 13 Sep 2019), the Office of the GSMO has cascaded, aligned and communicated the Strategy Map, Scorecards and Unit Objectives through communications and video teleconferencing. This October, the AFPPS Technical Working Group (TWG) revised the AFTRIP, aligning the Command's Strategic Objectives, Measures, Targets and Initiatives with the CSAFP. O/GSMO



have conducted Seminars/ Workshops and several TI&E's to subordinate units in preparation for the Revalidation of the Command's Institutionalization Stage. The current status of the AFPTRIP application for the Institutionalization Stage is still on-going for completion of the remaining documentary evidences with the correction and findings from the OSSSM and awaits the production of the Audio-Visual Presentation (AVP) for the Break Through Goals and Impact Statements. The Team GSMO have selected and targeted different AFP - wide personalities to give testimonies and share the Procurement Service Processes, Advantages, Efficiencies and Best Practices. The COMMANDER, AFPPS invited the Strategy Team from his former office - the Tactical Operations Wing Southern Luzon (TOWSOL) to share the path taken by the PAF Flight Plan 2028, its Performance Governance Report 2019 and Waypoints on 16 December 2019. As of today; we have been on the go, intensively holding AFPTRIP TWG meetings to fast track the completion of documentary requirements toward the conferment of the AFPPS to the Institutionalization Stage by Q1 2020.”

Two (2) Day Seminar Workshop on Scorecard Development and Crafting of the Scoreboard/ Dashboard in Preparation for The Gold

A 2-Day Seminar/Workshop on Scorecard Development and Crafting of Scoreboard/Dashboard 2019 was conducted at the GHQ Training School, CGEA , Quezon City on 21-22 November 2019 and it was participated by sixty (60) military personnel of AFPPS.

On 210830H November 2019, the seminar/workshop was formally opened by COL ARIEL A TABAQUERO PA (GSC), Chief of Staff, AFPPS. Right after the Opening Ceremony, the participants were briefed by MAJ JULIUS L GALLEON (QMS) PA, CHIEF GSMO on the House Rules, Background/ Objectives/ Overview of the Seminar, and other administrative announcements.

A lecture was conducted by 1LT PEARLY C REGALADO (QMS) PA , Chief of the Strat Com Branch, Strategy Management Division (SMD), Office for Strategic Studies and Strategy Management (OSSSM). She discussed the AFPTRIP Scoreboard and Dashboard. Another Resource Person, Mr Jayson L Clemente, Civilian Human Resource and Admin Officer II of the SMD, OSSSM discussed the AFP Transformation Roadmap aligned to the Chief of Staff Performance Scorecard. Immediately followed was the presentation of CPT MARIA TESS D DELIM (QMS) PA, Assistant Chief GSMO, on the AFTRIP Diagnostic Exams as a refresher which should be cascaded to the PC's and CO's. In the afternoon, the participants were grouped into PC's and CO's from Program 1, 2, 3 and 4 to work on their scorecard and scoreboard. Day 1 concluded at 1700H.

The following day, 22 November 2019, the group registered as early as 0700H and continued to prepare for their presentation. At 0930H, the AFPTRIP AFPPS TWG headed by COL EUGENE A BADUA PA (GSC) together with CPT DELIM (QMS) PA and Mr Clemente acted as panelists. First to present were the PC's where they presented the use of percentage in the performance measure. Second to present were the Program 4 wherein they presented the use of calendar days in measuring their performance. Third to present were the Program 3 followed by the Program 2 and finally the Program 1. Chief , 112nd Contracting Office , MAJ GABRIEL D TAYKO (CE) PA and Chief , 202nd Contracting Office MAJ JOEL K VERGARA PAF also presented their scorecards and scoreboards.

After completing the Program of Instruction set forth for the above mentioned seminar, the Closing Ceremony was formally conducted on 221500H November 2019 with COL RAMON F GUIANG PAF (GSC) , COMMANDER, AFPPS, as the Keynote speaker. This was preceded by the Awarding of the Certificate of Completion which was received in bulk by LTC MICHAEL P DUQUEZ (OS) PA, Chief, 113rd Contracting Office, being the most Senior Officer attendee. A group photo opportunity with the COMMANDER, AFPPS and Staff followed and simple snacks were served.

The common findings were the alignment of Commander's objectives to their units' goals which is to increase the percentage of issuance of NTP's from 80% to 100% by 2019.

The participants and the panelist agreed on the following:

1. Serving of NTP's as the Performance Measure where the CO's and PC's will anchor from the Commander's Scorecard;
2. The use of Percentage in the measurement of Serving of NTP's;
3. That GSMO will draft a uniform scoreboard ,for the approval of AFTRIP TWG, for distribution to the PC's and CO's;
4. That the PC's and CO's will submit their final output of scorecard and scoreboard on 061700H December 2019.
